Through their decades-long partnership with the Federal Depository Library Program, libraries collect, catalog, preserve and provide reference services to support a wide array of Oregonians, including business owners, lawyers, researchers, and students of every age.

H.R. 5305 updates and improves the Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP) by making it more responsive to the public and the needs of libraries

- ✓ Affirms no-fee permanent public access to all forms of government publications through a comprehensive distributed system emphasizing coordination and collaboration
- ✓ Defines and expands scope of digital collections
- ✓ Provides for increased flexibility for participating libraries
- ✓ Protects user privacy
- ✓ Broadens public awareness by expanding the number of libraries that could participate in the program
- ✓ Gives the Government Publishing Office (GPO) regulatory authority to create more tools and processes to ensure the ongoing strength and responsiveness of the program
