What has been plaguing you or going well with programs?

- Mark has been having trouble getting Super Smash Bros. characters unlocked for his gaming tournaments. Aimee said she has been having trouble getting her new teen advisory board members to gel and work together. Caitlin said that at a previous library her teen group was more interested in doing community-related work than library tasks.
- We discussed requiring registration versus no registration. Registrations don't necessarily work for teen programs. Sonja suggested registering more people and betting that not everyone on your list will come.
- Sonja reported having success with board game nights and simple, low-prep programming. She is still planning to do her big haunted house just before Halloween.
- Denise said she had success having the teen council do small projects.
- Caitlin is putting on a regular Saturday morning cartoon program, watching things like the Spongebob movie and *Over the Garden Wall* with snacks.
