### ACRL-OLA JOINT MEETING COMING UP

The Oregon Chapter of ACRL will meet jointly with the Oregon Library Association Academic Librarians Group during the OLA 1981 Annual Conference. The speaker, Dr. Mary Kinnick, will discuss "planning: the long and short of it." Ms. Kinnick is an educational consultant and formerly served as director of Instututional Research at Portland State University.

Ms. Kinnick's talk will be given during the Academic Librarians Break-fast at 7:30 am, April 25, at the Ashland Hills Inn.

CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS:

The OLA Conference will run from Wednesday, April 22 through Saturday, April 25, at the Ashland Hills Inn, 2525 Ashland Street, Ashland, Oregon 97520 (at the junction of Highway 66 and I-5).

Wednesday: Afternoon: Candy Morgan of the Oregon State Library and Jon Roberts of the Oregon Data Center will present How to Use Census Publications. Evening: Deborah Holleus, SOSC, and Dick Myers, OSL, will lead the ORDOCS Workshop.

Thursday: Morning: Survival in Difficult Times, a program of theory and practical advice (to be repeated Friday morning). Luncheon: Gary Strong, California State Librarian, will give the conference keynote speech, Managing for Changing. Evening banquet: Shakespearean actor Barry Kraft will present Books and the Bard.

Friday: Morning: Choice of breakfast meetings: Oregon Community College Librarians meeting, or AACR2-Scrambled Catalogs and Toast. Morning sessions: several, including: Getting the Network Together, led by Kappy Eaton of the U. of O., and Assertiveness Skills for Librarians, conducted by Jackson County Mental Health Services Staff. (Assertiveness will be repeated Friday afternoon.) Early Afternoon: Dr. Dervin, U. of W. School of Communications, will discuss Coping with Change, while Jenko Lukac of Lewis & Clark College will present an introduction to Automation of Library Acquisitions. Late Afternoon: OCLC User Group, led by Bruce Preslan, or Library Instruction - Who, What, When, How, conducted by Ray Anne Kibbey, SOSC.

Saturday: Following the Academic Librarians Breakfast, the Second General Session will be called to order. The agenda includes Bill DeJohn of PNBC, who will present future alternatives for that institution.

Collection Development Task Force

Members of ACRL interested in serving on a Task Force on Cellection Development are urged to call Pam Horan at the University of Portland Library (283-7111). The task force will serve as a focal point for programs to encourage, solicit, collect, and lend collection development statements, policies and other materials. It will also act as a repository for statements, guidelines, bibliographies, etc., and lend them to requesting libraries as a means of furthering resource sharing in the Northwest.

The recent purchase of a \$4500 two volume set of the Vatican frescoes of Michaelangelo by the University of Fortland and a group of NAPCU libraries (as reported in the latest issue of OLA News) provides a good example of cooperative collection development.
