# POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT CONTINUING LIBRARY EDUCATION COORDINATOR FOR THE STATE OF OREGON

The Oregon State Library and Portland State University invite applications and nominations for the position of Continuing Library Education Coordinator for the State of Oregon. The position, funded by the Library Services and Construction Act, will be housed at the Oregon State Library in Salem, Oregon and the Coordinator will receive a faculty appointment at Portland State University.

# Responsibilities

The Coninuing Library Education Coordinator is responsible for managing, implementing, and promoting the Continuing Library Education Project. This includes the following goals: 1) to establish an organizational framework which will encourage continuing education and meet the needs of library personnel in all types of library settings and geographical areas of the State of Oregon; 2) to set priorities and promote and develop continuing education activities; 3) to conduct workshops throughout the state; 4) to organize a Continuing Education Center and Clearinghouse of Information; 5) to evaluate the project and assess future needs; and 6) to work toward permanent funding support for the position through the Oregon State Library. The Continuing Library Education Coordinator will work with the Oregon State Library, LAMGO (Library and Media Groups of Oregon), and Portland State University to accomplish the goals of the project. Portland State University will serve as the fiscal agent for the project. The position involves statewide travel to conduct workshops in various geographical locations.

# Qualifications

Masters Degree in Librarianship or equivalent. Minimum three years of successful experience as a librarian and/or media specialist, to include demonstrated experience in conducting continuing education workshops and/or library science courses. Organizational, administrative, and leadership ability. Demonstrated ability to work effectively with diverse groups. Demonstrated verbal and writted skills. The Coordinator must hold or be eligible to acquire a valid Oregon Driver's License.

Appointment: This is a ten month position with a fixed term appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor. The duration of the project is from September 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985. with possible continuation.

Salary: \$18,000 plus benefits for 10 months, with possible extension.

# COMPUTER CONCERNS AND BIBLIOGRAPHIC INSTRUCTION CALL FOR INFORMATION

During the 1983 ALA Conference in Los Angeles, the ACRL/BIS Computer Concerns Committee identified a variety of topics which represent major areas of interest and activity relating to the integration of computers into bibliographic instruction. These topics are:

1. Instruction in the use of on-line public access catalogs;

2. Computer-assisted instruction in library use;

3. End-user searching of computerized bibliographic data bases;

4. Computer-mediated on-line searching;

5. Human-computer interaction.
