Put it on your calendars: this year's joint Oregon/Washington ACRL Chapter Fall Conference will be held at the Menucha Conference Center on October 23th and 24th. The conference theme will be 'Computers and the Human Spirit' - read Sherry Turkle's book 'Second Self; Computers and the Human Spirit' (Simon & Schuster, 1985) to get yourself in the mood.

The keynote speaker will be Ruth-Ellen Miller, director of the Cybernetic Systems Program at San Jose State University. Dr. Miller is billed as a 'social systems scientist' or 'biocyberneticist'. She has a decade of experience in the practice, teaching and development of the theory of social systems design/analysis and futures research. Her work in the Pacific Northwest includes assessments of hydroelectric technologies, potential Latin American markets, the criminal justice system, and emerging work/career patterns, as well as library information systems. She has a doctorate in systems science from Portland State University and has taught at PSU and at Marylhurst.

In addition to the keynote speaker the board is trying to organize a visit from a national ACRL officer. Contributed papers were solicited from the conference and letters of intent have been received from nine prospective speakers. The remainder of the program will be woven around these contributed papers and the discussions they promote. There will also, of course, be time for a party, walks around the Menucha grounds and socializing.

"LIBRARY CONGRESS"

On May 17 the OLA Reorganization Task Force hosted a Library Congress to find out if other members of the library community shared their vision of cooperation and communication.

The consensus of the meeting was that an ad hoc committee, consisting of the Task Force plus additional representatives from the various library organizations, continue to pursue the idea of an umbrella organization with a proposal and time line ready for the organization boards by September 15 and with board reactions due back by November 1. Other goals are to ask each group to join and financially support such activities as hiring a lobbyist by 1/7/87 and, starting now, to merge all similar committees.

Nancy Powell, Maureen Seaman, Terry Soohoo, and Connie Battaile attended from Oregon ACRL. Each of them has a copy of the report of the meeting if you would like more information.

ADVISORY BOARD NOTES

The Advisory Board met in Bend on May 9th. The weather almost cooperated. Business was completed over lunch in the park just in time to miss the rain.

CHAPTER ARCHIVES

The Advisory Board, under the leadership of Pat Wand, and with the assistance of Perry Morrison, has been considering the importance of preserving and maintaining an archival record of the chapter's activities. Guidelines have been developed that establish appropriate materials to go into the archives and designate persons responsible for collecting the documents. Michael Engle will serve as the first archivist for the chapter, and with the assistance of Pat Wand, will set up the appropriate files.

NEWSLETTER EDITOR

The Advisory Board has approved an amendment to the by-laws that would create a position of newsletter editor separate from the Advisory Board. The current newsletter is appointed from within the Advisory Board. Under the new amendment, the editor would be appointed by the President and would be a non-voting member of the Advisory Board. PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

The Newsletter Editor attends Advisory Board meetings and reports on newsletter business. The Newsletter Editor participates in all Advisory Board discussions, but does not vote on specific motions made in Advisory Board meetings.

ADVERTISING MUSEUM OPENS IN PORTLAND

The American Advertising Museum opens its doors to the public June 25, bring to Portland the first museum of its kind in the United States and possibly the world. Located in the historic Erickson Building in Old Town at N.W. 2nd Avenue and Couch Street, it will house permanent and special exhibits of advertising memorabilia, a theatre, bookstore and library. Advertising articles in all media have been donated by the Smithsonian and such companies as Coca-Cola, Jantzen, Nabisco and Campbell's Soup.

The Museum is under the directorship of Sarah Paulson, formerly Senior Marketing Associate with Christie, Manson and Woods International, Inc., the international art auction house in New York. It is expected to attract visitors and researchers interested in history, sociology and anthropology as well as business, according to Board Member Leonard Lanfranco of the Oregon Newspaper Publishers Association.

The library, which currently has a book collection of approximately 1500 volumes and a 240-volume set of <u>Printer's Ink</u> dating from the 19th century as well as vertical file material, will be open to the public. Paula Linke McCracken, former elementary school librarian at Park Rose School and M.L.S. graduate of the University of Portland, has worked with the Board over the past year to establish the library and is currently serving as the part-time librarian.

Students will be able to check out books through their schools, and photocopying will be available, both on-site and through interlibrary loan. An on-line catalog and membership in a bibliographic utility are planned. Consultation services were provided to the library by SLA members Dan Kniesner and Faye Powell.

Museum's hours are 11-5 Wednesday through Friday and 12-4 Saturday and Sunday. Visits by area librarians are welcomed. For further information, contact Sarah or Paula at 226-0000.

NEW LIBRARY

Willamette University Library is moving into a new building, the Mark O. Hatfield Library, which will eventually house all of Hatfield's senatorial and gubernatorial papers. Dedication is scheduled for September 4 with Daniel Boorstein as the speaker. The move will increase the library from 25,000 to 58,000 square feet. The new library will be automated using INLEX Corporation software, an integrated system.


ACRL/OREGON OFFICERS AND ADVISORS FOR 1986/87
