Oregon Reads 2009 Needs Your Help

As many of you know, the Oregon Library Association is sponsoring a statewide community reads program in 2009 as part of Oregon's celebration of its sesquicentennial. An OLA committee has selected the book ("Stubborn Twig" by Lauren Kessler, the story of Japanese immigrants to Oregon in the 20th century) and are making plans for a special publication of the book, developing ideas for events that individual libraries can hold, and a variety of other activities.

The goal is for every library in the state to bring Oregon Reads 2009 to their community in early 2009.

There is a statewide committee called Oregon 150 that is planning all the statewide activities for the Oregon Sesquicentennial. They have just released their first draft of their plan (www.oregon150.org) and we were disappointed to not see Oregon Reads in the plan.

So... this is why we need you! They are asking for input and we need to give it to them! Everyone, please e-mail Aili Schreiner at aschreiner@oregon150.org and tell her that Oregon Reads needs to be in their plan. Here are some key points:

- 1. The Oregon Library Association has committed to the project and a committee has been working on it for 10 months.
- 2. Libraries in communities throughout the state will be participating, from the biggest cities to the smallest hamlet. Mention if your library is already planning to participate.
- 3. Oregon Reads will share the story of immigrants from

- the west and Stubborn Twig features locales from throughout Oregon.
- 4. Oregon Reads needs to be a signature event of the Oregon Sesquicentennial Celebration as it will celebrate an Oregon story, written by an Oregon author and it takes place in Oregon.

Also, I would ask that you look at the list of Oregon 150 board members http://www.oregon150.org/board.html. If there is anyone you know personally, please contact them and tell them about Oregon Reads and what a wonderful opportunity it will be for Oregon 150. Please do not contact if you don't know them, but there are lots of people throughout the state that certainly are known to librarians.

Thanks in advance for making sure that Aili knows that Oregon Reads needs to be a part of Oregon 150!

Legislative News

Update from Salem

Things are moving in Salem

HB 2116 - The Ready to Read Grant Program changes passed both houses and is waiting for the Governor's signature. This will modify the focus to early literacy and summer reading as well as authorize \$1000 minimum grants.

SB 5523 - The State Library Budget passed and has been signed by the Governor. This includes the money for the minimum grants.

SB 950 - Protecting the email addresses of library users has passed and has been signed into law.

HB 2843 - The revisions to the obscenity statute passed out of the House Judiciary Committee and is in limbo for now. OLA supports the library exemption clauses. Funding for Eastern Oregon University's new library looks like it might be approved. This is much needed and long anticipated.

To participate, all that's needed are a computer (minimum of 128 MB of RAM, although 256 MB is recommended); Internet Explorer 5.5 Web browser, Java enabled; speakers; and Internet access of 56k or above. A microphone connected to the computer is optional for the audio, which also is available by a long-distance phone bridge (not a toll-free number).
