


BANNED BOOKS WEEK 2025 "SHOW-AND-TELL"








Umatilla Public Library created some amazing displays! Arianna Strong in Teen Services said the displays "definitely sparked conversation with people who didn't know about BBW!"




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Ione Library District got in on the action by offering to help patrons find banned books!

The Baker County Library is giving away copies of George Orwell's 1949 novel, "1984," as part of a campaign against censorship and book bans.

"The library will have a public discussion Oct. 9 at 6 p.m. to discuss what inspired Orwell, an English author, to write the dystopian novel about a totalitarian state. ... The Oct. 9 public event is part of the library's Let Freedom Read celebration Oct. 5-11, aligning with a national campaign opposing censorship and book bans. The 2025 theme reflects Orwell's novel — Censorship Is So 1984: Read For Your Rights."
